

Christ Is Not Plan “B”

When asked if one prefers heaven, hell, or earth, many prefer earth. Not Paul. He ranked heaven above earth, while he was still living in his prime. Paul ranked his love for Christ above his love for earthly living. (Phil. 3:20; Col. 3:1) Christ was Plan A for Paul in life and in death.

We thank God that some families and individuals are serving God in their prime, showing that Plan A is Christ. We can all promote Christ to Plan A by recognizing his incomparable value today! He can compete, and supersedes everything in this world. He is Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace. (Isaiah 9:6)
