- 5. What similarities are there between 2 Kings 17:7 and Exodus 20:2-3? What similarities are there between 2 Kings 17:12 and Exodus 20:4? Which of God's commands do the Israelites break?

6.	What sin did Jeroboam son of Nebat cause Israel to commit? How many times in 1-2 Kings is this sin mentioned?
7.	What was God's initial response to their sins (2 Kings 17:13)? Why? Do you think it is unloving or unjust for God to allow Samaria to be destroyed? Why or why not?
8.	Find Babylon, Cuthah, Avva, Hamath, and Sepharvaim on a map. What happens to these people when they arrive in Samaria? What is the king of Assyria's solution? Who does the priest of Samaria teach them to fear?
